#### City Rethinking HPRC Review Process

A study session will be held on Tuesday July 25<sup>th</sup> by the City Council and Planning Commission to discuss possible changes to the Historic Preservation Review Commission (HPRC) design review process. It is the HPRC that ensures historic structures within the City's historic districts maintain their historic integrity and the integrity of the historic district by adhering to the Secretary of Interior Standards and the Downtown and Arsenal Conservation Plans. The session goal is to find ways to reduce costs to the City, encourage housing development, and streamline the design review process. The Society Board of Directors is concerned that potential changes could include elimination of the HPRC and abandoning use of the above design standards. These changes would dramatically alter the character and integrity of our historic districts. The Board encourages members to attend and add more of our voices to the conversation to ensure that historic preservation continues to be an important goal of our City.

#### Mary Farmar Student Letters

In April third grade students from Mary Farmar Elementary School wrote Letters to the Editor wanting to know the history of five historic buildings and the Benicia Arsenal. The Historical Society was pleased to be able to respond to their requests. Articles on the Arsenal and Clocktower appeared in the Benicia Herald. The others on Commanding Officers' Quarters in the Arsenal, the State Capitol, Majestic Theatre, and Captain Walsh House were sent directly to Mrs. Estrada's 3<sup>rd</sup> grade class. # Did You Know? The Hastings Mansion by Richard Jenny

Once upon a time, a huge mansion occupied the northwest corner of what is now W. Military and W. 2nd St. Daniel Hastings was a 28 year old carpenter when he moved to San Francisco and, later, Benicia. He bought a butcher shop, prospered, moved his family here from back East, and bought the parcel. He became obsessed with building. The 1880's mansion had 4 stories, 21 bedrooms, a library, billiards room, exotic wood paneling, marble kitchen slabs, 5 fireplaces, 88 doors, 85 windows, and a 2000 gallon rooftop water tank. All the stairs made it hard to keep staff so the family moved to SF. After that home was damaged in the 1906 quake and repairs were completed, the family sold the Hastings Mansion to a priest. He deeded it to nuns who ran a boys boarding school. By 1937, the mansion was abandoned and torn down.
