Southern Pacific Caboose On Track To Restoration

In 2000, Southern Pacific donated a caboose to the City. Recently, the City reached out to the Main Street Foundation, which operates the Depot, and to former Mayor Jerry Hayes to discuss the future of the caboose. When it was acquired, the original intent was to place the caboose at the former train Depot. The BHS has committed, by resolution, to support the renovation and relocation of the caboose, and to participate in fundraising for this purpose. Historic Preservation and Housing

In the past few years the State has passed several pieces of legislation to make it easier to build housing. Unfortunately for Benicia, there are few provisions for protecting historic districts. Most recently there was concern about proposed sites in the our historic downtown, and at the City Cemetery and Benicia Arsenal, both on the National Register. Only the proposed cemetery site was removed. Two Arsenal housing projects approved in 2022 are being challenged in court. There is a need for housing and there is opportunity for infill development. Vallejo Stage Line, by Jerry Hayes

Milo Passalacqua was born in Benicia in 1886 and had worked in local shipyards and tanneries. In 1915 he was working in a Benicia grocery when he learned about a pair of men's attempt to start a bus line between Vallejo and Benicia. They had given up on the idea but Milo liked it. He believed a bus would cost \$1,000 but only had \$250. After Mr. Crooks at the Bank of Benicia turned him down for a loan, he borrowed \$500 from Benicia Brewery owner Gus Gnauck and \$250 from butcher Wally Wassmann. The next day Milo bought a bus in San Francisco. His friend Bert Mason drove it to Benicia but would not agree to be the driver, so Milo learned how to drive. The bus line became his first business and it ran for over 75 years.
